

# What to do after a work injury in Pennsylvania A Guide for Traveling Employees in Pennsylvania

If your job takes you on the road — whether for sales, training, or service calls — and you're injured while traveling for work, you may still qualify for workers' compensation under Pennsylvania law.

# Steps to Take After a Travel-Related Injury

## 1. Report the Injury or Accident Immediately

- o Contact your supervisor or HR right away even if you're out of town.
- o Follow up in writing (email works fine).
- Reporting within **21 days** is critical to preserve your rights.

#### 2. Seek Medical Attention

- o Go to the nearest hospital or urgent care.
- o Tell the provider the injury occurred while traveling for work.
- o You may have to follow up with an employer-approved doctor within **90 days** of returning.

#### 3. Document the Incident

- o Keep travel itineraries, hotel receipts, or mileage logs showing you were on a work trip.
- Save all medical records and correspondence with your employer.

## 4. Call a Workers' Comp Attorney

- o Travel injuries can get complicated especially if you were out of state.
- A lawyer can determine whether Pennsylvania or another state's laws apply and make sure you're covered.

# (1) Key Deadlines to Know

- 21-Day Rule: If you report your injury within 21 days, your benefits can start from the date of the injury.
- **90-Day Rule:** For the first 90 days, you may need to treat with an employer-approved doctor (if they've taken the proper steps). This is also the time period they can issue a temporary acceptance only.
- 120-Day Limit: You must report your injury within 120 days or risk losing all rights to work comp benefits.

# Common Mistakes Traveling Employees Make

- Thinking an injury "on the road" isn't covered.
- Only reporting the injury verbally.
- Not saving proof you were on a work assignment.
